Investing in Schools for our future

The new £21 million Meadowhead School opened and is a fantastic investment for education in the area. I know pupils and teachers are delighted. The new building comes 5 years after Meadowhead received Language College status - with a range of languages such as French, German, Spanish, Italian and even Mandarin.



Making us safer on our streets

I met the local Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) in Lowedges. They are part of the Safer Neighbourhood Area Team, who tackle anti-social behaviour and low level crime. The main nuisances in the area are illegal motorcycling and underage drinking. I continue to work closely with the police, local councillors and the community to tackle these. Neighbourhood Wardens helping the community

I visited Sheffield Homes' Lowedges office to meet the Neighbourhood Wardens who have had a tremendously positive impact locally.

Their job is to help residents, to work through problems they may have, as well as to patrol the estates to reduce anti-social behaviour. Sheffield Homes plan to increase the numbers of wardens across the city, including 8 more locally.



Jordanthorpe Health Centre open for business

The new £6million health care facility in Jordanthorpe is now open. The purpose-built centre houses GPs, NHS



dentists, a pharmacy, x-ray facilities, dietary services and much more. It is a welcome investment in community health and I'm extremely impressed with the work they are doing.

Respect for Shop Workers at the Co-op

I visited a number of Co-operative Stores as part of the Usdaw union's campaign to protect shop workers from violence and abuse. We need to support the staff in local shops in providing a valuable service to the community. I also discussed with managers and staff the work they are doing to ensure that they only sell alcohol to people over 18. As a responsible retailer the Co-op will not hesitate to challenge those who appear too young to buy these items.

Raising awareness of body piercing

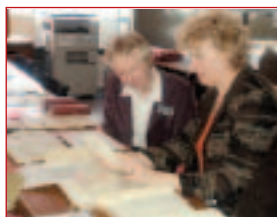
I helped launch a new information leaflet aimed at teenagers considering



having their body pierced. This initiative is led by constituent Christina Anderson, whose son Daniel died 4 years ago from septicaemia after having his lip pierced. Since Daniel's death I have campaigned on this issue. I was successful in getting the law changed to give councils the power to regulate body piercers. In my previous Ministerial job I was part of the government team that organised the commemoration of the Abolition of the Slave Trade Act of 1807. To 'gen up' on what happened in the city I visited Sheffield Archives and discovered the role local people took in the anti-slavery movement. It was interesting and inspiring to learn that so many Sheffielders got



involved to campaign for the emancipation of slaves.

A new Jamaican Prime Minister and the Panama Canal

Having become a Foreign Office Minister in the re-shuffle in July, I was very pleased to meet the new Prime Minister of Jamaica, Bruce Golding, following his country's general election. I then went to Panama where the expansion of the canal is creating lots of opportunities for British companies.



New Deal for Carers

Carers are people who work incredibly hard looking after relatives or friends no longer able to do so themselves. I visited the Sheffield Carers Centre to get views on how government could help more. Their priorities included more and better information, especially when they first become a carer; more financial support and increased breaks, with better day centre provision and respite care placements. I passed on this information to the relevant Minister, who will consider it as part of the widespread consultation currently taking place.
